### STUDENT INFORMATION

#### Agendas

Agenda will be sold (\$8.00) by the PTA during the Saturday Open House **and** during the first week of school. We hope each student will purchase an agenda as it is a great organizational tool.

#### Make-up Work

- ❖ We will adhere to the LRMS makeup work policy for excused and unexcused absences. Please refer to this policy in your student agenda.
- ❖ If you are absent, you are responsible for obtaining missed assignments. Don't wait until your return. Once you are feeling better, call a friend or check Blackboard.
- ❖ If you are absent on an "A day" and return on a "B day," you are expected to have your work ready for the following "A day."
- ❖ **Late work** is accepted only in extreme circumstances. Don't wait until the day something is due to inform your teacher that a personal situation is keeping you from completing a project or big assignment. Talk to your teacher well in advance if you have a problem.

#### Absences

Since students have a three week break after each quarter, it is our hope that it would be rare for a student to miss school due to a trip or vacation. However, if you find yourself in a situation where you will be absent for a trip, you must obtain prior approval (from the principal) for the absence to be excused. In addition, our team **does not distribute work in advance** for students who will miss our class for a trip. Students need to follow team procedures for obtaining and turning in missed assignments.

#### Academic Assistance

Each core teacher will designate days before and after school for extra help.

#### Dress Code

**Girls:** No low-cut tops. Shorts and skirts should be **at least** mid-thigh. There is a simple way to measure this if you are unsure of what mid-thigh means. (Shorts: The length of the **inseam** should be half the distance between the top of the inner leg and the top of the knee. Skirts: The hem should hit the same spot that you determined was mid-thigh for shorts. Too much trouble? Wear capris or long pants...we have air conditioning!) **Guys:** Keep those pants pulled up. Use a belt if this is a problem for you.
